



Who do Christians say made the world?


Who do Christians say created the world?

We then looked at how Christians say thank you to God for giving us this wonderful world and how we have plenty of food to survive. One way some Christians do this is through celebrating Harvest.


We created some artwork using chalk pastels [it got messy!] of baskets that Christians would take to church to share with everyone, the baskets contained foods that have been harvested.

Christians believe that God is powerful, creative, orderly and generous.


In the Christian faith, all people are important to God.
