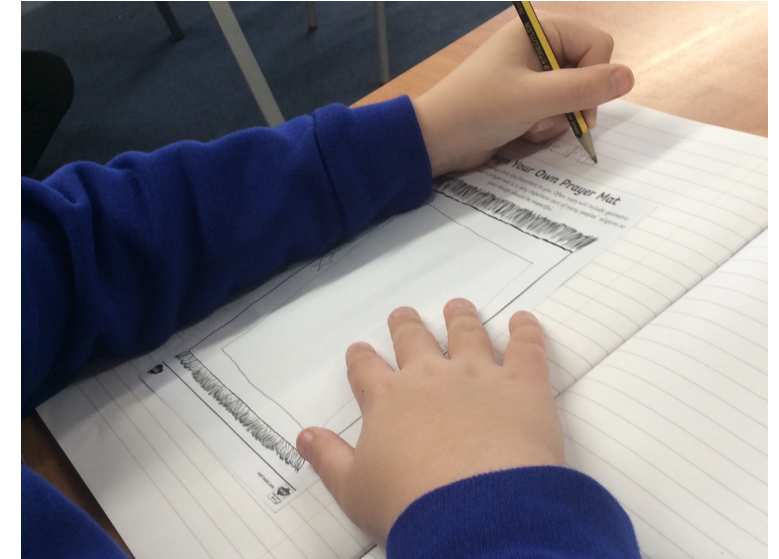
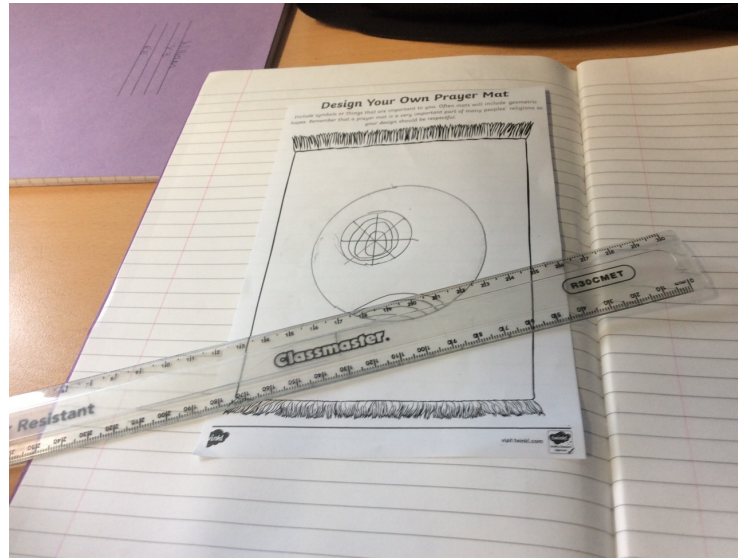
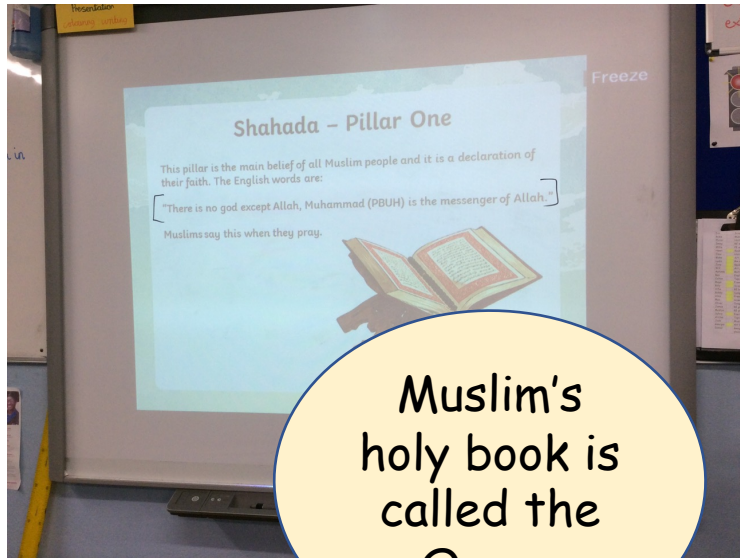


The first thing that we needed to know was that we never draw or show Muhammad (PBUH).

We found out about the 5 pillars of Islam.





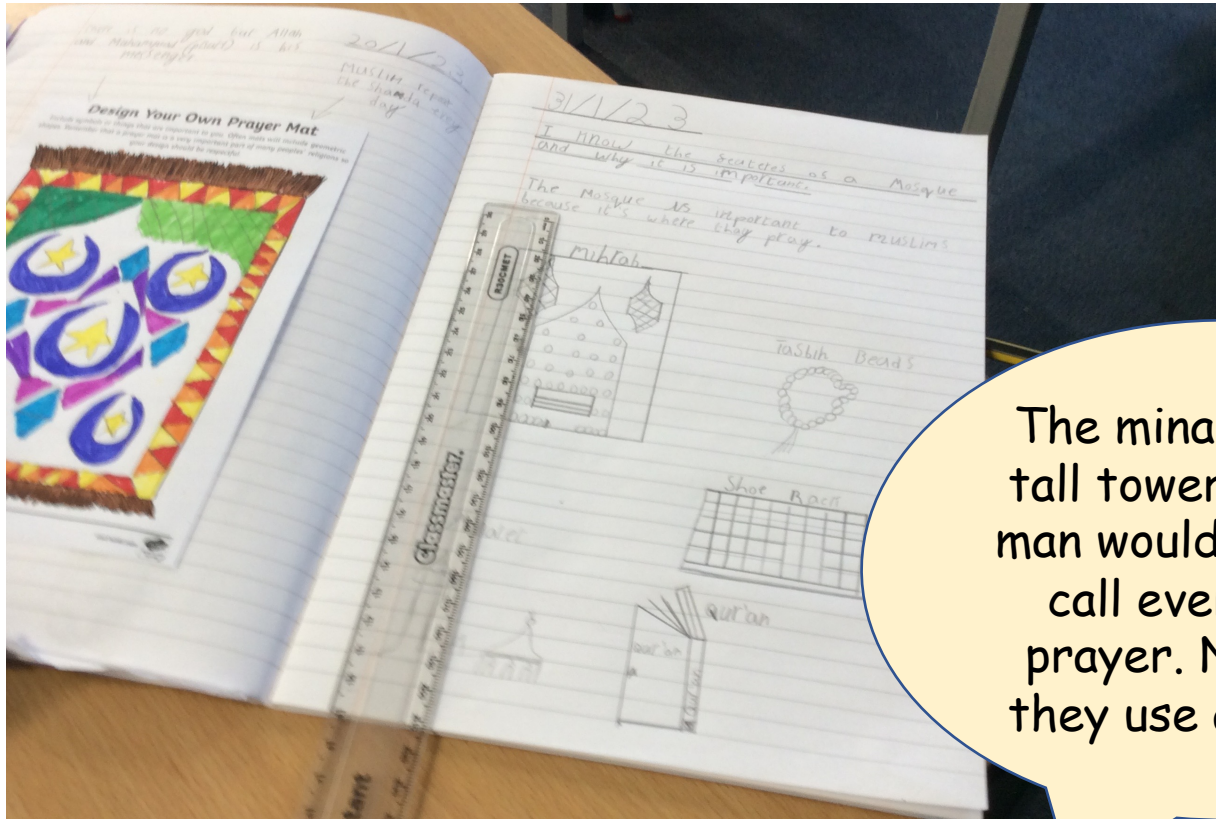
Muslims pray on a mat and always face Mecca. Some mats have compasses.

We did a virtual tour of a mosque with Hibba and Issa.

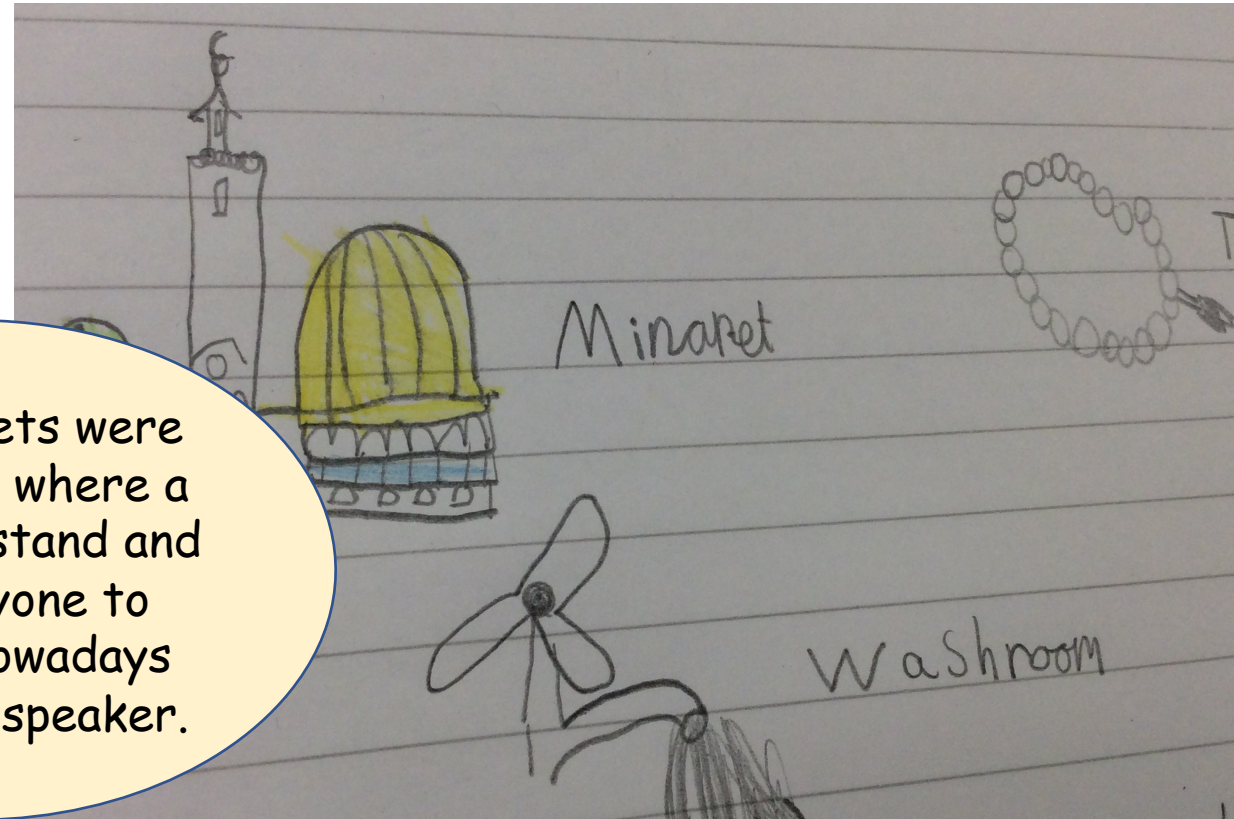


Everyone puts their shoes in a shoe rack before prayer as a sign of respect.

The minarets were tall towers where a man would stand and call everyone to prayer. Nowadays they use a speaker.

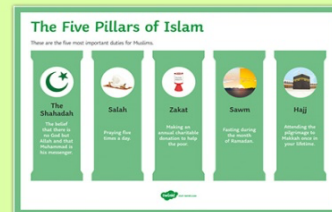

Know the mosque is a special place to Muslims and the Quran is their holy book.

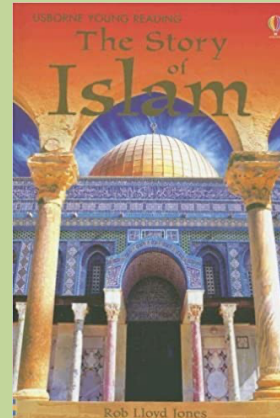
Know the 5 pillars of Islam (shahaba, salat, zakat, sawm, hajj)
