

For our initial lesson we listened to the song we were going to learn and used the music notation as well as the lyrics to have a first go at singing it. We focussed on the chorus first and then started working on the rhythm of the verses.



It was interesting that the one on Singup was at a different pitch to the one by Bruno Mars.



We began to learn the harmony today using an echo track at first. It helped to see the notes on screen as you could see whether it was higher or lower than the melody.



Because the song was already high pitched it was hard to get to the harmony which was higher again.





Today we all sang the harmony over the top of the backing track. Then we practised fitting all the verse words into the line. Finally we used our confidence to sing with more volume while keeping a story-telling tone.

We worked out where the harmony went as it wasn't all of the way through. It stopped and started.




We put our harmony together with the rest of the school singing the melody.


