

It was interesting to see how some words sounded similar to the English word but others were completely different.






We learnt the names of more vegetables and took part in group games.




In this lesson we applied the vegetables vocabulary we learnt to making a sentence and saying how much of something we had.

There are many last consonant silent letters in French. The final 's' is silent in the word 'le<u>s</u>' and pronounced similar to the English sound 'leh'. However, if it is followed by a noun that starts with a vowel like 'oignons', 'épinards' or 'aubergines' the 's' in 'le<u>s</u>' will be pronounced almost like a 'z' sound. This is called liaison.

What I will learn:

How to ask for a 1 kilo and/or ½ a kilo.



How to use the structure 'je voudrais' (I would like).
