

I can explain what Incarnation and Messiah mean in the context of the bible

The old testament gave clues about who the Messiah would be. These were given to them by the prophets of the Old Testament.

We looked at artwork to see the symbols and images that showed Jesus was the Messiah to most Christians

Some of the clues said he would be born in Bethlehem to a Virgin.

Incarnation means most Christians believe Jesus was God sent to Earth in human form.

Matthew chapter 1 and 2 said Jesus was born in Bethlehem and was a descendent of David.

The wise men: Matthew Chapter 2

1 Jesus was born in the town of Bethlehem in Judea during the time when Herod was king. When Jesus was born, some wise men from the east came to Jerusalem. They asked, "Where is the baby who was born to be the king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him."

3 When King Herod heard this, he was troubled, as were all the people in Jerusalem. Herod called a meeting of all the leading priests and teachers of the law and asked them where the Christ would be born. They answered, "In the town of Bethlehem in Judea. The prophet wrote about this in the Scriptures:

6 "But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are not just an insignificant village in Judah. A ruler will come from you who will be like a shepherd for my people Israel." Micah 5:2

7 Then Herod had a secret meeting with the wise men and learned from them the exact time they first saw the star. He sent the wise men to Bethlehem, saying, "Look carefully for the child. When you find him, come tell me so I can worship him too."

9 After the wise men heard the king, they left. The star that they had seen in the

Jewish people still hope for a **Messiah** to come. They hope for the Messiah to spread the healing of the nations from the leaves of the tree of life. This hope is built in to the way Jewish people see the world.

Christians believe that **Jesus** is the Messiah – more than a messenger or prophet, but actually God himself in the flesh. They believe his death and resurrection heals the divide between God and humans.

In **Christianity**, some believers expect the **return of Jesus** to establish his kingdom on earth, where justice and salvation build a new Jerusalem with neither hate nor tears.


