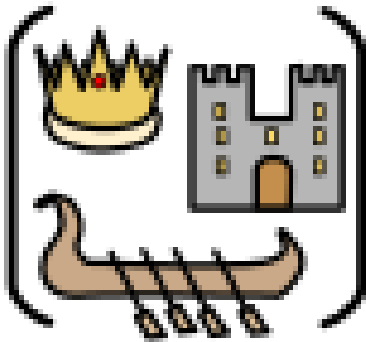

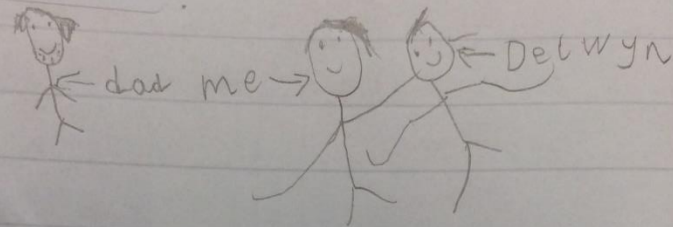

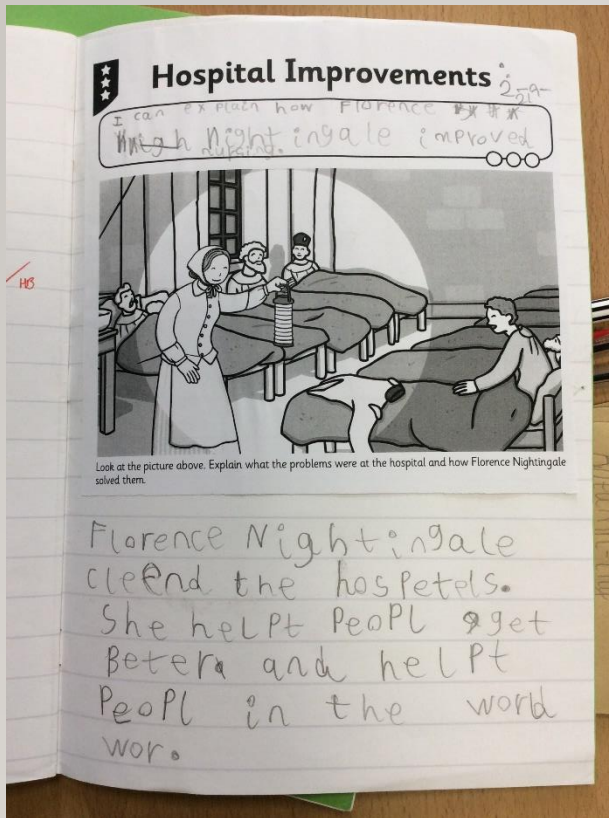

### Who Was Florence Nightingale?

Florence Nightingale was born in 1820.

She was named Florence after Florence in Italy, where she was born.

She died in 1910.

She is still famous today.

She became a nurse and helped **soldiers** who were hurt in the war.

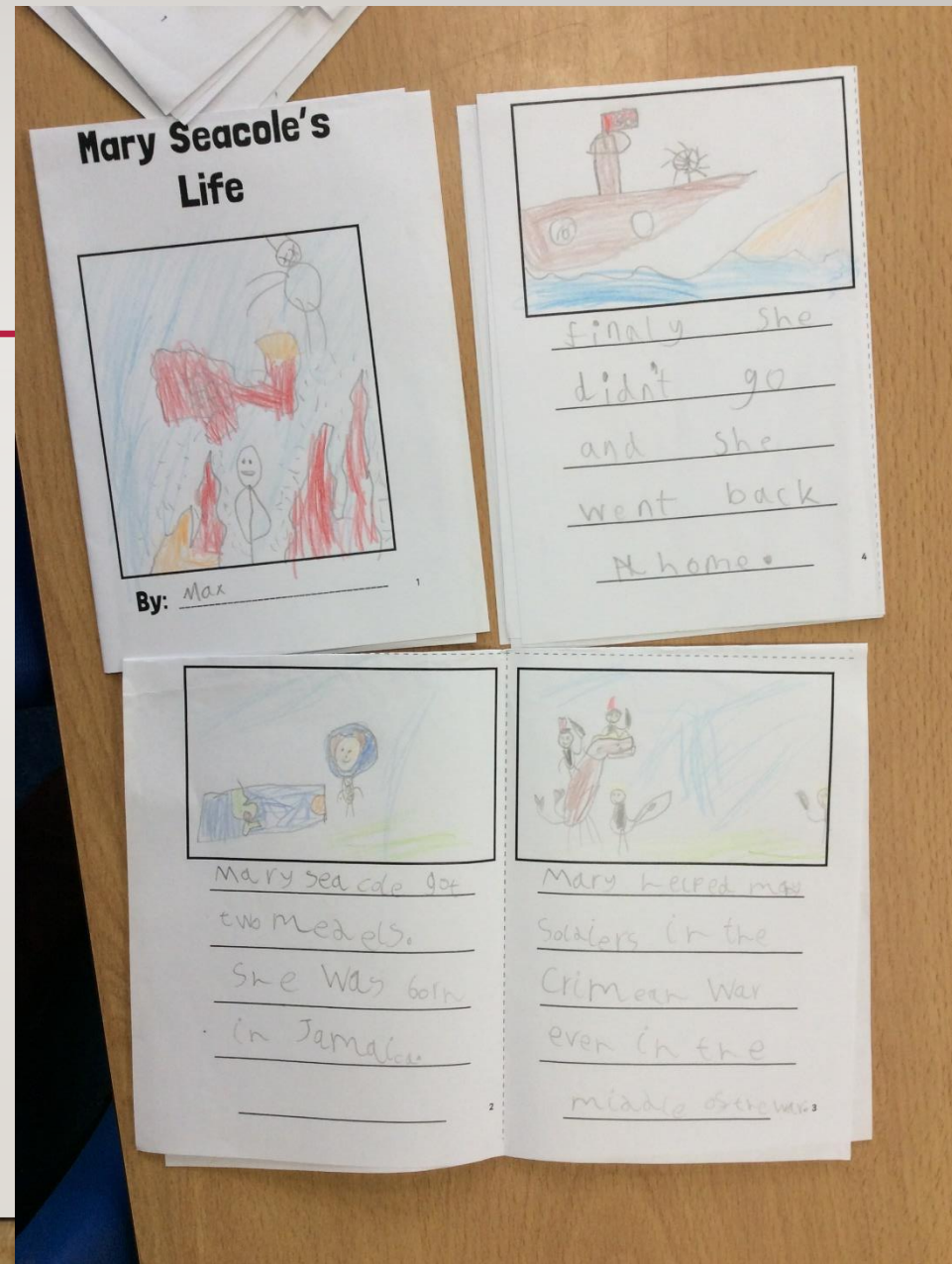




Mary Seacole was

# Edith Cavell

Who was Edith Cavell?



Edith was born on the 4<sup>th</sup> December 1865 in a village in Norfolk.



Edith's father was a vicar and she learned from the Bible, and him, that it was important to help others.



Edith travelled to Belgium to become a governess, and later to Austria to learn about helping the sick. She then returned home to look after her sick father.

In 1896 Edith trained to be a nurse at the Royal London Hospital.

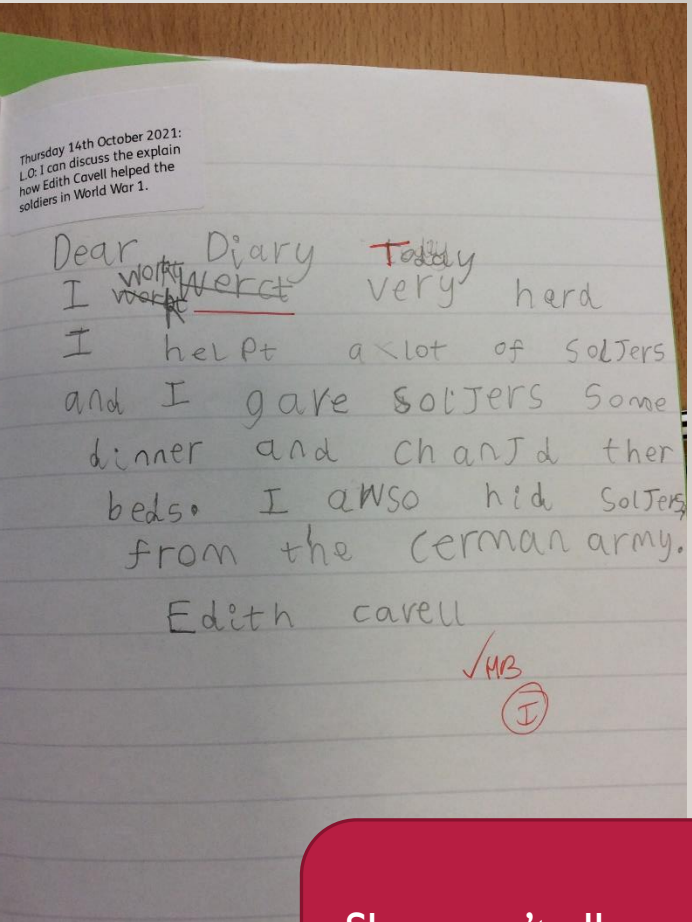


In 1907 Edith went back to Brussels to nurse and was asked by a doctor (who had been inspired by Florence Nightingale) to be in charge of training nurses at a special nursing school

Mary Seacole was born in Jamaica.

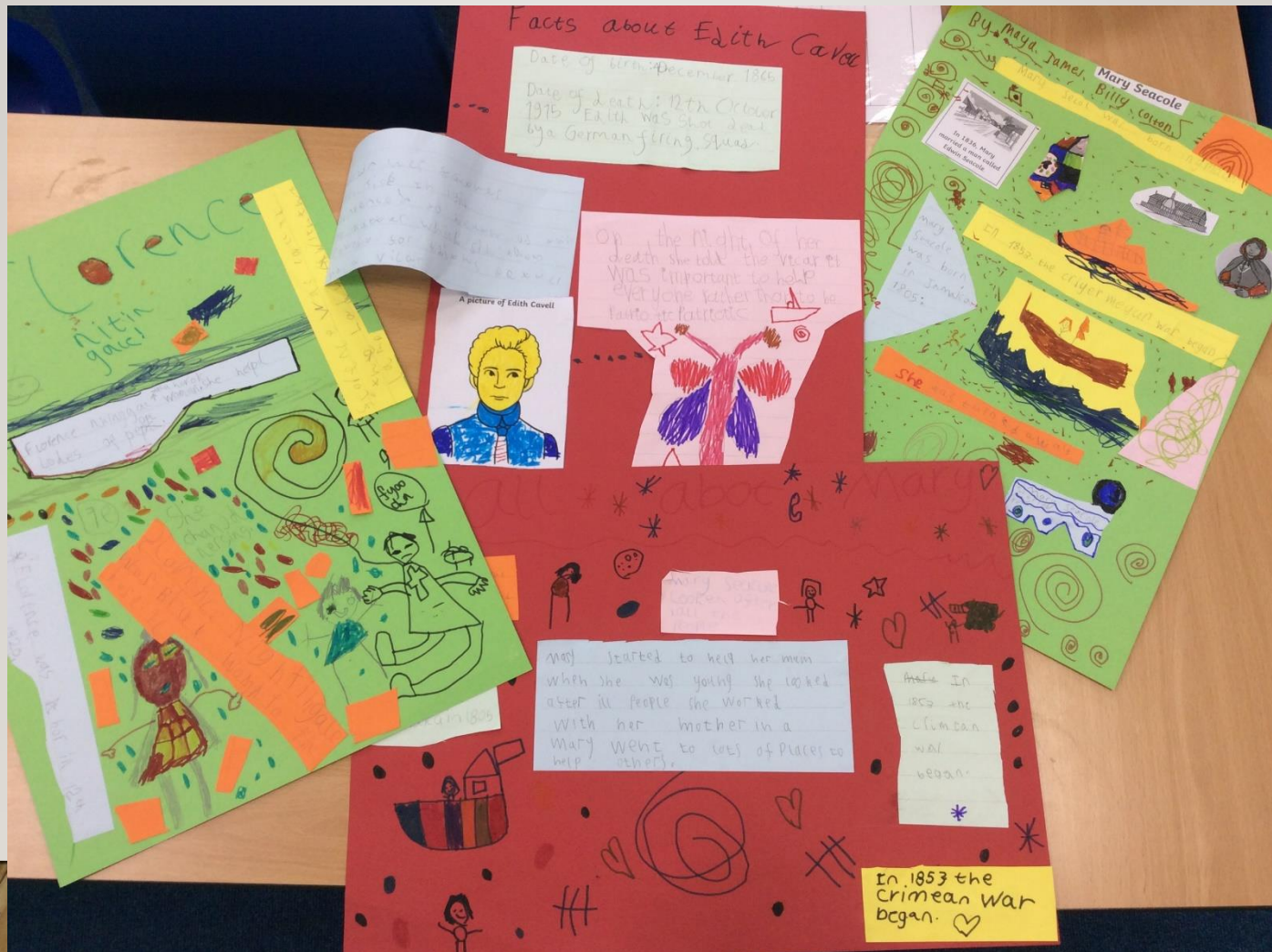
She built the British Hotel Hospital.

### Forever Facts

Mary Seacole was a nurse. She was born in Jamaica in 1805. Her mother was Jamaican and her father was British.

Mary Seacole wanted to join the nurses treating the soldiers injured in the Crimean War but the British Government refused.

Mary Seacole paid for herself to go and set up a hospital for soldiers to receive food, drink and treatment.

Florence Nightingale was a nurse. She was born in 1820 in Florence, Italy although her parents were British.

Florence Nightingale treated soldiers during the Crimean War and was known as 'The Lady with the Lamp'.

Florence Nightingale is remembered for changing the way hospitals were run.

Edith Cavell was a nurse. She was born in Norfolk in England in 1865.

During WWI, Edith Cavell nursed and saved soldiers from both sides of the war.

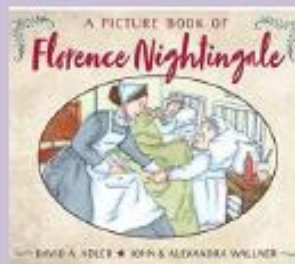
Edith Cavell was arrested for treason and was killed in 1915.

Crimean War	A war between Russia on one side and Britain, France, the Ottoman Empire (Turkey) and Kingdom of Sardinia on the other. (1853 – 1856)
WWI	First World War (1915 – 1918)
nurse	Someone who is trained to care for sick and injured people.
hospital	A place where you are treated if you are poorly.
allies	Countries that fight together.
enemy	A country or group of people who attack or try to harm other people.
soldier	A person who serves in an army and fights when there is a war.
treason	The crime of betraying your country by helping the enemy.
