To use a recorder to play a song.

To know how to hold your recorder and use it to produce a sound



You have to seal your lips around the top when you play or it screeches.



You have to sit up straits so you can get enough air in your lungs to play



To be able to play a B note

To play B you cover the whole at the top and the one at the back.

You need to make sure your fingers are in the right places.



To be able to play an A note

A is when you cover the hole at the back and the top 2 at the front.



If you practise you will know what to do.

To be able to play a G note



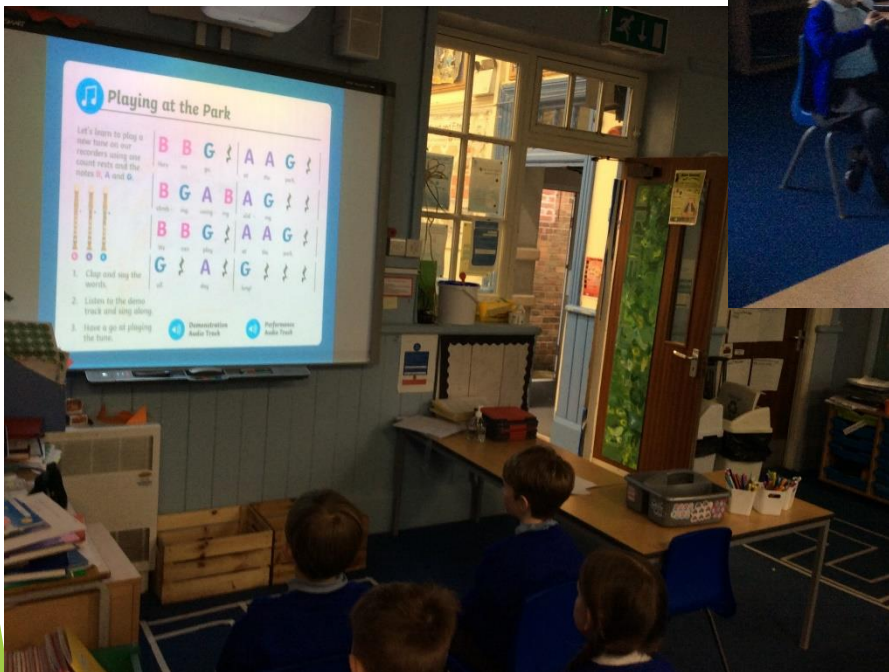
A short note you blow quickly and a long note you have to hold.

To play G you have to cover the back and the top 3 holes at the front.

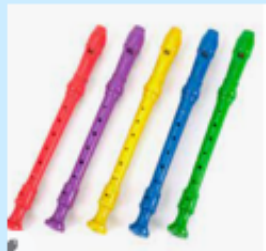


To be able to perform a song using learnt notes.

You have to follow the music so that you play at the right times.



You have to make sure you read the music so that you know which note to play.
