Foundation for Living: The Wise and Foolish Builders, Matthew 7:24-27

We discussed why some Christians' use this story as a foundation for living.

If Christians don't listen to Jesus they may think they will be swept away like the house.





Christians interpret the Bible differently. Here are four responses to the miracle stories.

1

Jesus was a miracle-worker because he was God in the flesh. Christians today should also pray for healing miracles – Jesus is still alive and God is the same today as he was then. He can heal, and he does too.

Jesus was a miracle-worker and the son of God, so we should worship him. However, healing can take place through applying modern medicine too – and that is another way God heals today. Prayer is important, but so is using our skills and knowledge.


The stories of Jesus' miracles are not to be taken literally: the writers wanted to show how special Jesus was. Today we need to look for a spiritual meaning rather than a literal one. Here, Jesus shows that anyone can come to Jesus and be given new spiritual life.


Jesus did not heal everyone who was ill in Galilee when he was on Earth. Not everyone is healed when Christians pray – illness and dying are part of life. Jesus does promise the spiritual healing that forgiveness can bring – healing a person's relationship with God.

Imagine two Christians talking about the story of the healing of the centurion's servant (Luke 7:1-10). They want to try to put Jesus' good news into action in the world today. How should they do that?!

SKETCH OUT THEIR CONVERSATION, TAKING TWO OF THE VIEWPOINTS GIVEN ABOVE





‘Good news’


What is wrong with the world?

We discussed what some Christians think Jesus would do to make the world a better place. We then research problems in the world and how we would try and solve them.






Jesus used his time to help and heal people - I would become a medic



For peace I would encourage people to be kind


Prayer: I don't pray but Christians' prayer to God for advice

Forgiveness: Christians forgive each other because that's what they think Jesus would do.





How do Christians' decide to live?


