<b><u>Observations and Discussions – Update on actions</u></b>  <b><u>PE Spend</u></b> <p>Sports equipment purchased – A PE bench was bought in response to a health and safety audit stating that existing equipment was unfit for purpose. We have recently had another risk assessment audit of equipment and another bench and 'gymnastics table' will need replacing/fixing. This will be done when the budget is available in the Spring.</p>	
<b><u>Active 30</u></b> <p>This is continuing to develop with staff training in imoooves this term. Imooove promotes active lessons. On the visit Helen was able to observe Class Lynhers active music lesson, twinning aerobic exercise with beat, rhythm and percussion. It was evident that the children were fully engaged and enjoying themselves. The resource we purchased using Sports premium budget (yoga balls, trugs, drum sticks).</p>	

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## Swimming

Year 4,5 and 6 (44chn) are in the process of completing a 10 week swimming course at Saltash Pool. We are on track for all but 6 children to meet the required 25m expectation. There is still 3 weeks left to run. A decision on what to do with these will be made on the completion of the course.

Links are being discussed between Whitsand Pool and a local swimming teacher to see if we can offer support to these 6 children.

## CPD

Building on the success with the dance CPD, Gymnastics CPD will be investigated for Autumn 2019

## Clubs

Plymouth Argyle football club has no discontinued due to the success of the football club led by our parents and was deem unnecessary expenditure.

Rugby club is now available in association with Torpoint Tigers. This is a trial hoping that children want to continue the training on Sundays in Torpoint.

Clubs offered for KS1 are Netball, Rugby, Football and Dance. With Yoga being offered in the Summer term

Clubs for FS are Dance and Yoga in the Summer term.

Sailing club in association with the Cawsand Bay Sailing Club has been set up for the Summer Term. On successful completion of the course children will have reached the equivalent of Level 2 of the RYA junior sailing scheme.

RW has liaised with Arena sport partnership about guidance for Sports premium spend and the support days and intervention schemes that they offer. The Action plan was written with Michelle form Arena. Organised for the Summer term are Sugar smart leaders, School council will received £250 and decide on what to spend the money on (Sport and healthy focus), alternative sports day, literacy support day for year.
