We had a go at creating some art work inspired by Matisse.

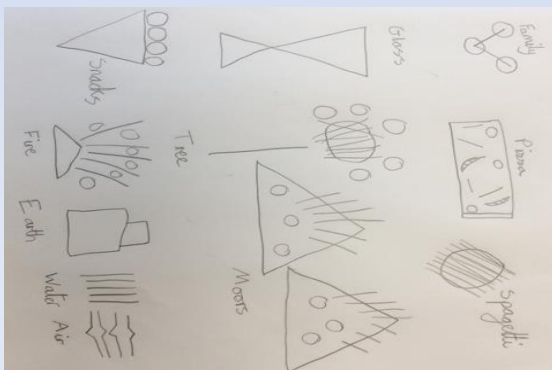
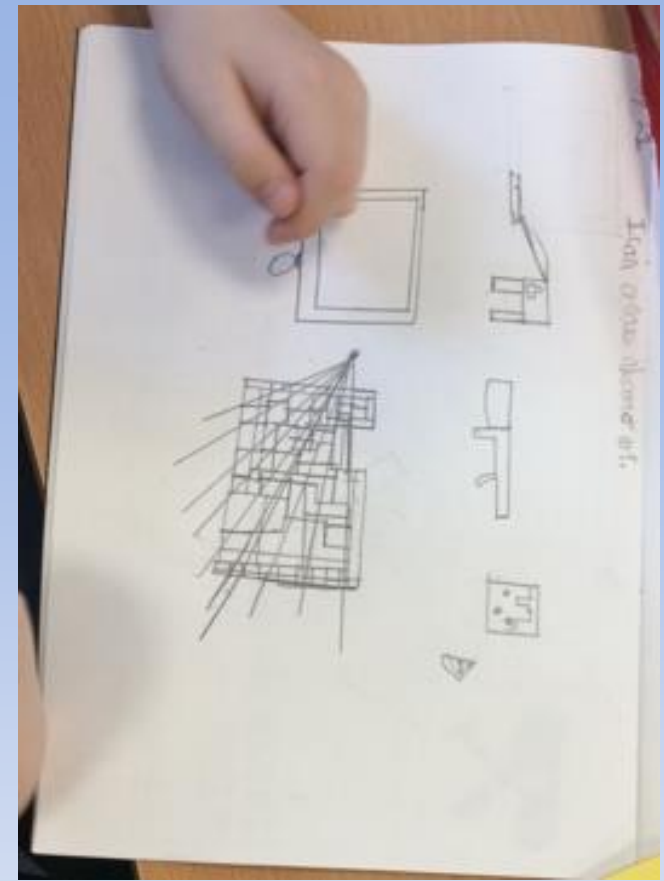
We were introduced to the artist Wassily Kandinsky, a Russian painter famous for his colourful abstract art.

Subject Specific Vocabulary

Abstract art

Art that doesn't attempt to represent and accurate depiction of reality. Instead it uses shapes, colours, forms and gestural marks

Artist

A person who creates paintings or drawings.

Henri Matisse (1869-1954)

French artist known for his use of colour. He was a draughtsman, printmaker and sculptor.

Wassily Kandinsky (1866-1944)

A Russian painter famous for his colourful abstract art.
