

We reflected on what the Christian creation story suggests is great about our world.








We looked at, and re-enacted, the story of 'the Fall' and explained why things might go wrong.














Christianity is one of the five main world religions. It began after the death of Jesus.

The words 'Christian' and 'Christianity' come from the name, 'Jesus Christ.'

Jesus is also known as Jesus Christ, Jesus of Nazareth, The Good Shepherd, Lamb of God, Light of the World, and Bread of

Christians believe in the Trinity. There is one God, but He is three separate people: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is sometimes known as the Holy Ghost.

The Ten Commandments were given by God. They can be found in the Old Testament. Christians try to live their lives by following the Ten Commandments.


Some Christians pilgrimage to holy places, such as Jerusalem (where Jesus died), Bethlehem (where Jesus was born) and Nazareth (where Jesus grew up).

Catholics may pilgrimage to Lourdes, in France, where miracles were said to have occurred, or Rome, in Italy, where the Pope (the head of the Catholic church) lives.

Easter and Christmas are important Christian festivals. Christmas celebrates Jesus' birth and Easter celebrates Jesus' death and resurrection

The Christian holy book is the Bible. It has two parts: the Old Testament and the New Testament.
