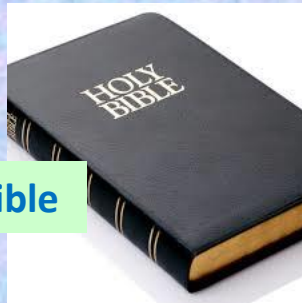


We also thought about the school badge and how it represents our school community and our values.

We talked about different symbols that show we belong (like our uniform) and we learnt about symbols of the Christian and Jewish faiths.

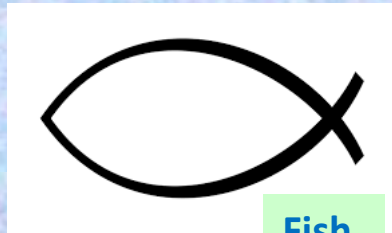

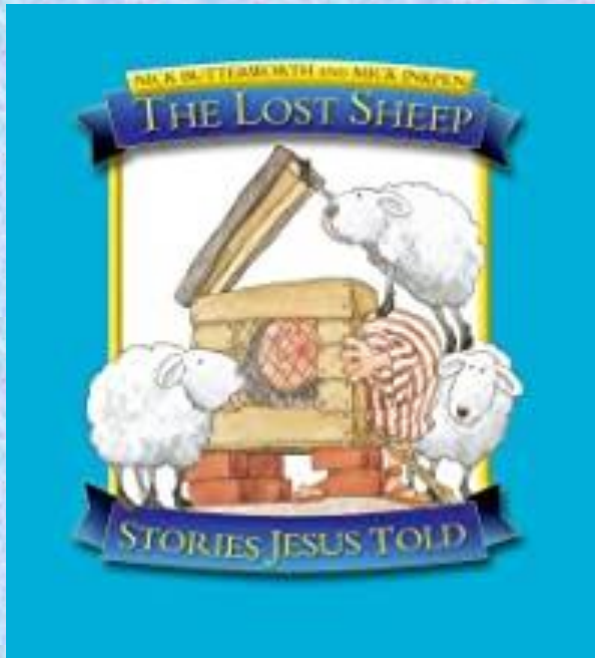

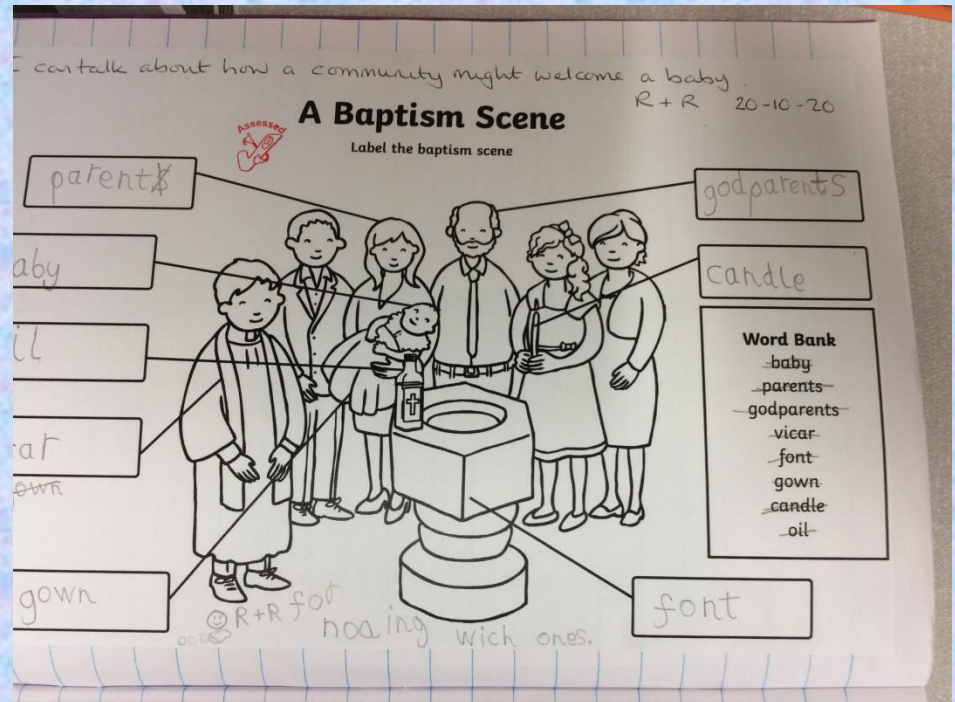

We listened to the story of 'The Lost Sheep' and discussed how everyone is unique and valuable.

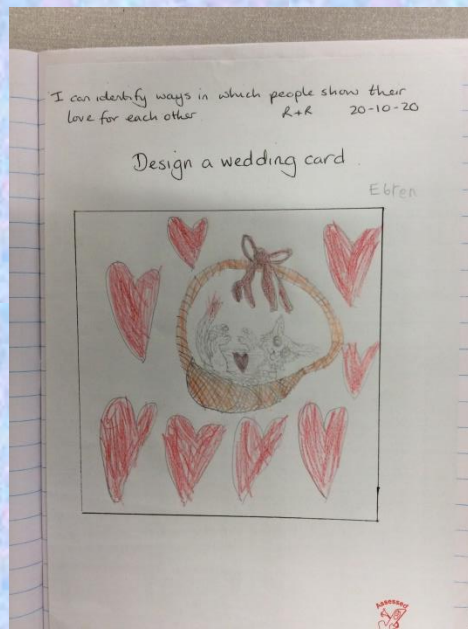


Then we found out how different communities welcome a baby.

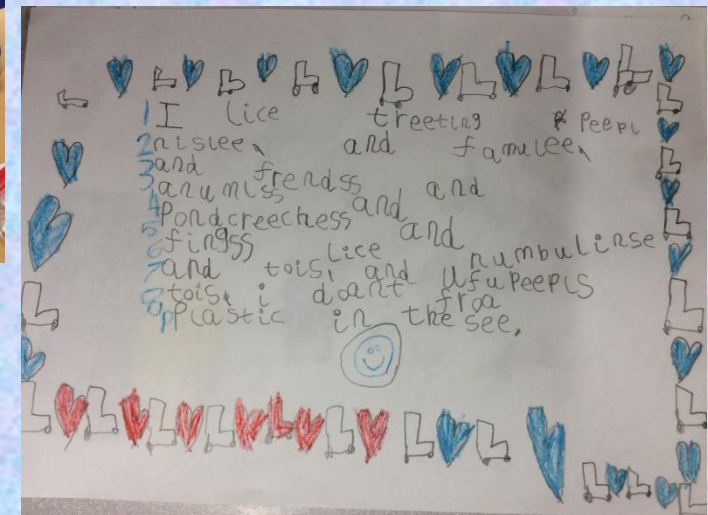
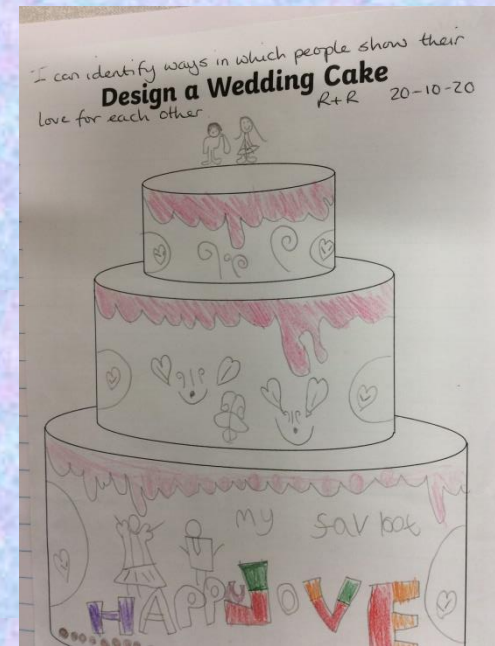


"I think it's like they're being welcomed from the dark into light."

"Dark is like when you're cross and the light gives you hope."

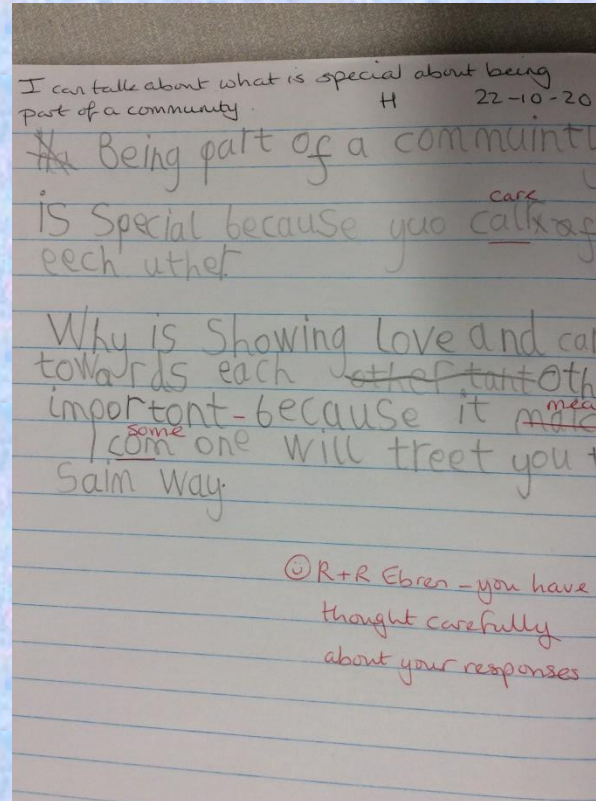


We learnt about different wedding ceremonies and talked about how people might show their love for each other.

Different faiths and communities have different ways of making a promise to love and look after each other.

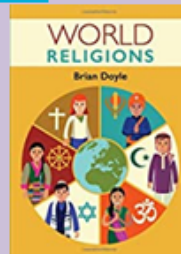
In the Christian faith, all people are important to God and in the Jewish faith people are reminded to love their neighbour.
