





For the first lesson of our unit we looked at the geographical position of France and learnt how to say that countries neighbour each other.



It was interesting that France had a lot of neighbours.





We looked more closely at France and its cities and linked in with our maths skills and previous knowledge of numbers in French to ask and answer questions about how far apart different cities were.



It was good to use the numbers we had already learnt in a different way.

We linked in with our geographical skills in this lesson to learn the 8 compass directions in French and then use these to describe the location of places to each other.



We learnt the compass points in French and then tested how well we knew them with the corners game in the hall.



We discussed what we already knew about Paris and then tried to guess the name of different landmarks. We focussed on the grammar of a sentence to say what you could do in Paris and the verbs you would use.

There were a lot of things you could do in Paris. I would like to go walking in the gardens.






