#### **Observations and Discussions**

All staff undertook training which supported their role in May 2018 as reported in governing body meetings. There have been no breaches of any of the GDPR policies reported. Simon spoke to staff to discuss the impact of GDPR.

The impact of GDPR has been:

- Self-registration has been abolished so full names are not displayed.
- Birthdays no longer appear on the newsletter
- Only first names are used on anything that goes out of school e.g. the poppies for the remembrance display in the village
- The locked boxes have been used for all child protection meetings and in a confidential case recently to transport all documents
- At the beginning of the school year (September) a reminder of our privacy notice was sent to all parents about how we use their data.
- All data collected at the beginning of the school year has been processed in line with GDPR.
- The pupil file in the office is now kept in a locked drawer
- A new safe, locked cabinet is in place in RN's office to be used
- We have used the retention policy when clearing out old diaries to check on which ones should be kept.
- Staff have used school emails rather than private ones when dealing with professionals.
- Egress (secure email system recommended by DfE) is used to send any information to other agencies
- Care plans removed from the staff room
- No childrens names against photos
